# Reading

# Pupils will be taught to:

- sight read high frequency words and common exception words
- recognise and join in with predictable phrases
- relate reading to own experiences
- re-read if reading does not make sense
- re-tell with developing accuracy
- discuss book titles and events
- make predictions on basis of what has been read
- make inferences on basis of what is being said and done
- read aloud with pace and expression, i.e. pause at full stop; raise voice for question
- recognise capital letters—full stops—question/exclamation marks
- read common suffixes, ie, -s, -es, -ing, -ed
- know the difference between fiction and non-fiction texts
- learn simple rhymes and poems about a theme
- apply phonics knowledge to de-code words for reading
- begin to read with fluency.



# **Writing and Grammar**

## Pupils will be taught to:

- use correct formation of lower-case letters and recognise the letter families
- use correct formation of capital letters
- use correct formation of digits
- use finger spaces to separate words and ensure letters sit on the lines.
- introduce use of capital letters—full stops—question/exclamation marks
- compose a sentence orally before writing it
- use capital letters to begin a sentence, for names and personal pronoun 'I'
- write clearly demarcated sentences
- write a sequence of sentences to form a short narrative
- begin to use suffixes in writing, i.e., -ing, -ed, -es, -s
- use 'and' 'so' 'but' to join ideas
- use phonics knowledge to be able to spell phonetically
- spell common exception words



### **Mathematics**

Pupils will be taught to:

- count to and across 100, forwards & backwards from any number.
- read and write numbers to 100 in numerals correctly
- say 1 more/1 less to 100
- count in multiples of 2, 5 & 10
- represent numbers using objects and use the language of equal to, more than and less than
- read and write numbers from 1-20 in numerals and words
- use number bonds and subtraction facts to 20.
- solve one-step problems
- add & subtract 1 digit & 2 digit numbers to 20, including zero
- recognise a half and a quarter of object, shape or quantity
- measure and begin to record length/height, weight/mass, capacity/volume and time
- solve one-step multiplication and division problems using objects, pictorial representation and arrays
- recognise and name common 2-D and 3-D shapes
- describe position, direction and movement
- sequence events in chronological order
- use language of day, week, month and year
- tell time to hour & half past
- recognise and know the value of different coins and notes.
