<p>At Wickham Common Primary School, art is a loved and valued subject. In lessons, children have many opportunities to be creative; and through perseverance and with resilience, children learn to develop their skills. Learning is progressive, not just across the year in each unit but from year to year as children build on previous knowledge and skills. The children have the opportunity to work with a range of media, in order to become proficient in drawing, painting, sculpture and other art, craft and design techniques.</p> <p>As pupils progress through the curriculum, they should be able to think critically and develop a more rigorous understanding of art and design. They should also know how art and design both reflect and shape our history, and contribute to the culture, creativity and wealth of our community.</p>	<p>Art is delivered across the year groups by teaching specific skills. The teaching and implementation of the Art Curriculum at Wickham Common Primary school is based on the National Curriculum. Our curriculum drivers are at the heart of our curriculum where we base our structured medium term plans and weekly plans. This enables children to learn specific skills, techniques and to build on their knowledge of artists, designers and craft makers. A focus on colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space help the children to understand the elements of art.</p> <p>When children start school with us in EYFS, they will have lots of opportunities to express themselves and be creative. The children are given ample opportunities to mark make, paint, and print and explore a range of mediums. We begin by letting children explore and use a variety of artistic effects to express their thoughts and feelings, refining this over time and building on their skills as they progress. Children will be encouraged to draw inspiration from the real world, thinking about how we define different colours, shapes, textures and smells. Children will have opportunities to work collaboratively, sharing their ideas and skills and reflecting on what they have accomplished.</p>	<p>Art and Design monitoring takes various forms. In KS1 Ongoing assessments may take place at the end of each lesson and topic.</p> <p>Teachers use this information to inform future lessons; ensuring children are supported and challenged appropriately. A key component of this is pupil voice; school leaders use pupil voice as an effective tool to ascertain the pupils' ability to express themselves through a range of different mediums. Sketch book monitoring throughout all year groups also takes place once a term to compliment this, allowing leaders to ensure our artists have the opportunity to develop their skills fully and showcase their talents.</p> <p>Children in Foundation Stage are assessed within Expressive Arts and Design and their progress is tracked termly.</p>

<p>At Wickham Common Primary School, we aim for a high-quality art and design education, which will engage, inspire and challenge pupils, equipping them with the knowledge and skills to experiment, invent and create their own works of art, craft and design. Over the course of their time here at Wickham Common Primary School, the pupils will be able to think critically and develop a more rigorous understanding of art and design. Children will also know how art and design both reflect and shape our history, and contribute to the culture, creativity and wealth of our nation.</p> <p>Our teaching and learning will enable pupils to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Produce creative work, exploring their ideas and recording their experiences.</li> <li>• Become proficient in drawing, painting, sculpture and other art, craft and design techniques.</li> <li>• Evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design.</li> <li>• Know about great artists, craft makers, and designers, and understand the historical and cultural development of their art forms.</li> </ul>	<p>In Key Stage 1, we build on the skills learned in EYFS and the children are introduced to more new mediums, techniques and the children are inspired by artists and the world around them. In KS1 our young artists are given sketch books. This gives them room to record ideas, practise new techniques and to further refine their skills. Creativity is valued and children enjoy the opportunity to participate in experiment both in and outside the classroom.</p> <p>At Wickham Common Primary School we ensure that our Curriculum Drivers are reflected in our planning so that the children gain a varied art curriculum. Our planning enables progression based on prior learning, so that pupils are able to develop their techniques, including control and use of a range of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an awareness of various types of art, craft and design.</p> <p>During lessons, pupils are taught key vocabulary, practical skills, creativity, evaluation of art, and to explore line, shape colour, value, form, texture, and space. Pupils create sketch books to record observations, review and revisit ideas and create ideas.</p> <p>They practise and improve techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture using a range of materials. Children will be taught about contemporary and modern artists. Over their time at Wickham Common, pupils are taught based on our Threshold Concepts to ensure they achieve the end of KS2 outcomes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Express feelings, thoughts and mood through colour and texture.</li> <li>• Explore, invent, create and reflect.</li> <li>• Use a variety of artistic techniques.</li> </ul>	<p>At the end of each unit, children will be able to recall artists, skills and techniques learned and be able to evaluate a piece of art using key vocabulary.</p> <p>The impact of the curriculum will be monitored through a combination of discussions with pupils and staff, book looks and learning walks to provide a comprehensive understanding of the quality of the curriculum and highlight areas for further development.</p>
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
